



Order under Section 69 Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

File Number: LTB-L-094593-25

In the matter of: 104, 1080 KINGSTON RD

And

MICHAEL CARRICK Tenant

SKPM Rents 1 (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict MICHAEL CARRICK (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

The application was heard by videoconference on February 5, 2026. The Landlord's legal representative Sharon Harris, two agents for the Tenant, Michael Carrick and Heather Carrick, and Tenant support person Mary Callan attended the hearing. Michael Carrick confirmed that he had authorization to act on behalf of the Tenant.

Before the start of the hearing, the parties advised that they had reached an agreement. As a result of the resolution discussion, the parties mutually agreed to resolve all matters at issue in the application and requested an order on consent. I was satisfied that the parties understood the terms and consequences of their consent.

Agreed Facts:

1. The parties agree that the Tenant has made payments to the Landlord that have not yet cleared the Landlord's bank account. These payments have not been deducted from the total arrears owing. The payments made are as follows:
 - Payment of \$585.00 made on January 3, 2026;
 - Payment of \$1,875.93 made on January 28, 2026; and
 - Payment of \$585.00 made on February 1, 2026.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$1,057.05. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$34.75. This amount is calculated as follows: $\$1,057.05 \times 12$, divided by 365 days.

5. The Tenant has paid \$1,650.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed. This amount has cleared the Landlord's bank account and has been deducted from the total arrears owing.
6. The rent arrears owing to February 28, 2026 are \$3,331.98.
7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
8. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$950.00 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.
9. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$1.97 is owing to the Tenant for the period from January 1, 2026 to February 5, 2026.

On consent of the parties, it is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$3,517.98 if the payment is made on or before February 28, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenant may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after February 28, 2026 but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before February 28, 2026.**
5. If the Tenant does not void the order, the Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$1,682.71. This amount includes rent arrears owing up to the date of the hearing and the cost of filing the application. The rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit are deducted from the amount owing by the Tenant. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
6. The Tenant shall also pay the Landlord compensation of \$34.75 per day for the use of the unit starting February 6, 2026 until the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
7. If the Tenant does not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before February 28, 2026, the Tenant will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from March 1, 2026 at 4.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before February 28, 2026, then starting March 1, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.

9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after March 1, 2026.
