



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

In the matter of: 102, 32 CRAIGTON DR

And

Erika Horvat Tenant

Metcap Living Management Inc. (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Erika Horvat (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on January 27, 2026.

The Landlord's Representative Sofia Enriquez, the Tenant and the Tenant's Support M. Horvat attended the hearing.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenant did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$1,799.00. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$59.15. This amount is calculated as follows: \$1,799.00 x 12, divided by 365 days.
5. The Tenant has not made any payments since the application was filed.
6. The rent arrears owing to January 31, 2026, are \$5,262.01.
7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.

8. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$1,799.00 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.
9. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$17.18 is owing to the Tenant for the period from August 15, 2025 to January 27, 2026.
10. The Landlord requested a termination of the tenancy by way of standard order.
11. The Tenant acknowledged that the arrears of rent are owing and requested that her tenancy be preserved. The Tenant testified that she is a mother of three children, she had lost her job, and she is now receiving financial aid from Ontario Works. She further testified that she receives approximately \$3,950.00 from her child tax credit and Ontario Works.
12. The Tenant proposed a repayment plan in the amount of \$200.00 per month and continuing on until the arrears are paid in full.
13. The Landlord's Representative submitted that the landlord did not agree to the repayment plan.
14. Balancing the interests and prejudices to each of the parties, I find that the repayment of the arrears by way of the Tenant's proposed payment plan is reasonable based on her circumstances. This will allow the Tenant's housing to be preserved and repayment can be made with prejudice to the Landlord alleviated by allowing the Landlord to apply to the Board for termination of the tenancy without further notice to the Tenant in the event the Tenant fails to comply with the conditions in this Order.
15. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'), and find that it would not be unfair to grant relief from eviction subject to the conditions set out in this order pursuant to subsection 83(1)(a) and 204(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. The Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$5,448.01 which represents the amount of rent owing up to January 31, 2026, and the cost of filing the application.
2. The Tenant shall pay this amount owing to the Landlord as follows:

The Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$200.00 per month on the 20th day of each month starting February 20, 2026, and continuing on until April 20, 2028 inclusive, and a final payment on May 20, 2028 in the amount of \$48.01.
3. If the rent for February 2026 have not already been paid, the Tenant shall pay February's rent in full on or before February 20, 2026.
4. The Tenant shall also pay to the Landlord new rent on time and in full as it comes due and owing for the period of March 1, 2026, through to May 1, 2028, or until the arrears are paid in full, whichever date is earliest.

5. If the Tenant fails to make any one of the payments in accordance with this order, the outstanding balance of any arrears of rent and costs to be paid by the Tenant to the Landlord pursuant to paragraph 1 of this order shall become immediately due and owing and the Landlord may, without notice to the Tenant, apply to the LTB within 30 days of the Tenant's breach pursuant to section 78 of the Act for an order terminating the tenancy and evicting the Tenant and requiring that the Tenant pay any new arrears, NSF fees and related charges that became owing after January 31, 2026.
