



Order under Section 78(6) Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

Tobis Investments Inc. (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Deven Brine and Olivia Visicale (the 'Tenants') and for an order to have the Tenants pay the rent they owe because the Tenants did not meet a condition specified in the order issued by the LTB on October 31, 2025 with respect to application LTB-L-066749-25.

This application was decided without a hearing being held.

Determinations:

1. The order provides that the Landlord can apply to the LTB under section 78 of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act') without notice to the Tenants to terminate the tenancy and evict the Tenants if the Tenants do not meet certain condition(s) in the order. This application was filed within 30 days of the breach.
2. The prior order LTB-L-066749-25 notes there are two Tenants: Deven Brine and Olivia Visicale. The Landlord notes only one Tenant, Deven Brine in the application. In the Declaration in support of the application, the Landlord notes both Tenants Deven Brine and Olivia Visicale breached the prior order LTB-L-066749-25 which supports there are two Tenants that the Landlord is claiming were in breach of the prior order LTB-L-066749-25. The application is amended to reflect there are two Tenants; Deven Brine and Olivia Visicale.
3. I find that the Tenants have not met the following conditions specified in the order:

The Tenants failed to pay \$500.00 towards the arrears on or before January 15, 2026.

The Tenants failed to pay the lawful monthly rent in the amount of \$1,835.96 due on February 1, 2026.

4. The previous application includes a request for an order for the payment of arrears of rent and the order requires the Tenants to make payments by specific due dates. Accordingly,

in addition to eviction, the Landlord is entitled to request an order for the payment of arrears owing.

5. The Tenants were required to pay \$5,143.78 for rent arrears and the application filing fee in the previous order. The amount that is still owing from that order is \$4,143.78 and that amount is included in this order. This order replaces order LTB-L-066749-25.
6. Since the date of the previous order, the Tenants have failed to pay the full rent that became owing for the period from November 1, 2025 to February 28, 2026.
7. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$1,835.96 from the Tenants and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord.
8. Interest on the rent deposit is owing to the Tenants for the period from January 1, 2026 to February 10, 2026.
9. The amount of the rent deposit and interest on the rent deposit is applied to the amount the Tenants are required to pay.
10. The Landlord is entitled to daily compensation from the day after this order is issued to the date the Tenants moves out of the unit at a daily rate of \$60.36. This amount is calculated as follows: \$1,835.96 x 12, divided by 365 days.

It is ordered that:

1. Order LTB-L-066749-25 is cancelled.
2. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenants is terminated. The Tenants must move out of the rental unit on or before February 21, 2026.
3. If the unit is not vacated on or before February 21, 2026, then starting February 22, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
4. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after February 22, 2026.
5. The Tenants shall pay to the Landlord \$4,407.07*. **(Less any payments made by the Tenants after this application was filed on February 5, 2026).** This amount represents the rent owing up to February 10, 2026, and the cost of filing the previous application.
6. The Tenants shall also pay to the Landlord \$60.36 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting February 11, 2026, to the date the Tenants move out of the unit.
7. If the Tenants do not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before February 21, 2026, the Tenants will start to owe interest. This will be a simple interest calculated from February 22, 2026, at 4.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
