



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

Alicia Ann Nickerson Tenant

2491364 Ontario Inc. (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Alicia Ann Nickerson (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on February 3, 2026.

The Landlord's representative, Jason Pain, and the Tenant attended the hearing.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenant did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$1,830.71. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$60.19. This amount is calculated as follows: $\$1,830.71 \times 12$, divided by 365 days.
5. The Tenant has paid \$3,988.42 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
6. The rent arrears owing to February 28, 2026, are \$1,939.71. The Tenant understood the nature of the proceedings and agreed during the hearing that she owes this amount.
7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
8. There is no last month's rent deposit.

Relief from eviction

9. The parties were unsuccessful resolving the issue of rent arrears through a payment plan.
10. The Tenant participated in the hearing and agreed that she owes the outstanding arrears. When I asked her regarding her income and expenses, she was unable to provide me with a clear calculation. She indicated that ODSP pays for a portion of her rent. When I asked the Tenant regarding delaying the eviction she left the hearing. The matter was held down, but the Tenant did not return.
11. The Landlord's representative sought an extended eviction order for termination and eviction to February 28, 2026, for the Tenant to pay off all outstanding amounts and void the order.
12. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'), and find that it would not be unfair to postpone the eviction until March 31, 2026, pursuant to subsection 83(1)(b) of the Act, I find that a short postponement is reasonable to allow the Tenant an opportunity to preserve her tenancy, or if necessary, secure alternative accommodation.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the Board in trust:**
 - \$2,125.71 if the payment is made on or before February 28, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
- OR**
- \$3,956.42 if the payment is made on or before March 31, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenant may also make a motion at the Board to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after March 31, 2026 but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before March 31, 2026.**
5. If the Tenant does not void the order, the Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$475.57. This amount includes rent arrears owing up to the date of the hearing and the cost of filing the application. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
6. The Tenant shall also pay the Landlord compensation of \$60.19 per day for the use of the unit starting February 4, 2026 until the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.

7. If the Tenant does not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before March 31, 2026, the Tenant will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from April 1, 2026 at 4.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before March 31, 2026, then starting April 1, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after April 1, 2026.
