



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

File Number: LTB-L-103163-25

In the matter of: 805, 200 Elm St.
Toronto, ON M5T 1K4

Between: Elm Place Inc. – 200/222 Elm Street Landlord

And

Spencer Wilton Tenant

Elm Place Inc. – 200/222 Elm Street (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Spencer Wilton (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on February 26, 2026.

Only the Landlord's Representative, Sharon Harris, attended the hearing.

As of 9:31 a.m., the Tenant was not present, nor represented at the hearing, although properly served with notice of this hearing by the LTB. There was no record of a request to adjourn the hearing. As a result, the hearing proceeded with only the Landlord's evidence.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenant did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice, or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$2,071.71. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$68.11. This amount is calculated as follows: \$2,071.71 x 12, divided by 365 days.
5. The Tenant has paid \$7,400.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
6. The rent arrears owing to February 28, 2026, are \$336.84.

7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
8. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$2,012.54 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.
9. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$6.60 is owing to the Tenant for the period from January 1, 2026, to February 26, 2026.
10. I have considered all the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'), including whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenant, and find that it would not be unfair to postpone the eviction until March 31, 2026 pursuant to subsection 83(1)(b) of the Act.
11. The Tenant was not present at the hearing to share evidence with respect to their circumstances. The Tenant has paid off most of their arrears and the Landlord is willing to grant the Tenant a slight delay. I find it appropriate to grant the Tenant time to March 31, 2026 to pay off the arrears.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$2,594.55 if the payment is made on or before March 31, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenant may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after March 31, 2026, but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before March 31, 2026.**
5. As of the date of the hearing, the amount of the rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit exceeds the arrears of rent, compensation and the cost of filing the application the Landlord is entitled to by \$1,797.15. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing. However, the Landlord is authorized to deduct from the amount owing to the Tenant \$68.11 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting February 27, 2026, until the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
6. The Landlord or the Tenant shall pay to the other any sum of money that is owed as a result of this order.

7. If the unit is not vacated on or before March 31, 2026, then starting April 1, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
8. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after April 1, 2026.

Less the amount the Tenant paid to the Landlord since the application was filed	- \$7,400.00
Total the Tenant must pay to continue the tenancy	\$2,594.55

B. Amount the Tenant must pay if the tenancy is terminated:

Rent Owing to Hearing Date	\$7,435.99
Application Filing Fee	\$186.00
Less the amount the Tenant paid to the Landlord since the application was filed	- \$7,400.00
Less the amount of the last month's rent deposit	- \$2,012.54
Less the amount of the interest on the last month's rent deposit	- \$6.60
Total amount owing to the Landlord	\$(1,797.15)
Plus, daily compensation owing for each day of occupation starting February 27, 2026	\$68.11 (per day)
**Ongoing daily compensation continues to accumulate until the total amount owing (excluding costs) is \$50,000.00.
