



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

1847548 Ontario Ltd. (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Laura Kelemen and Richard Farkas (the 'Tenants') because the Tenants did not pay the rent that the Tenants owe.

This application was heard by videoconference on March 25, 2026.

Only the Landlord's Representative, Bryan Rubin, attended the hearing.

As of 1:30 p.m., the Tenants were not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the LTB. There was no record of a request to adjourn the hearing. As a result, the hearing proceeded with only the Landlord's evidence.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenants with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenants did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenants were still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$2,329.16. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$76.58. This amount is calculated as follows: $\$2,329.16 \times 12$, divided by 365 days.
5. The Tenants had not made any payments since the application was filed.
6. The rent arrears owing to March 31, 2026, are \$12,007.48.

7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
8. There is no last month's rent deposit.
9. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 (the 'Act'), including whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenant and find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act. The Landlord's Legal Representative was not aware of any of the Tenant's circumstances that would support delaying or denying eviction. The Tenant did not attend and thus I did not have an opportunity to hear evidence from them on the issue. Considering all the circumstances, I am satisfied that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenants is terminated unless the Tenants void this order.
2. **The Tenants may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$14,522.64 if the payment is made on or before April 12, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenants may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenants had paid the full amount owing as ordered, plus any additional rent that became due after April 12, 2026, but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenants may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenants do not pay the amount required to void this order, the Tenants must move out of the rental unit on or before April 12, 2026.**
5. If the Tenants do not void the order, the Tenants shall pay to the Landlord \$11,778.82. This amount includes rent arrears owing up to the date of the hearing and the cost of filing the application. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
6. The Tenants shall also pay the Landlord compensation of \$76.58 per day for the use of the unit starting March 26, 2026, until the date the Tenants move out of the unit.
7. If the Tenants do not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before April 12, 2026, the Tenants will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from April 13, 2026, at 4.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before April 12, 2026, then starting April 13, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after April 13, 2026.

Total amount owing to the Landlord	\$11,778.82
Plus, daily compensation owing for each day of occupation starting March 26, 2026	\$76.58 (per day)
**Ongoing daily compensation continues to accumulate until the total amount owing (excluding costs) is \$50,000.00.
