



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

Hazelview Property Services Inc (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Abirame Mayooraan and Kamalanathan Mayooraan (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on March 12, 2026.

Only the Landlord's legal representative, Peter Lopez attended the hearing.

The Tenant was not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the LTB. There was no record of a request to adjourn the hearing. As a result, the hearing proceeded with only the Landlord's evidence.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenant did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$1,240.70. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$40.79. This amount is calculated as follows: \$1,240.70 x 12, divided by 365 days.
5. The Tenant has paid \$1,225.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
6. The rent arrears owing to March 31, 2026, are \$2,467.11.

7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
8. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$1,183.49 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.
9. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$4.83 is owing to the Tenant for the period from January 1, 2026, to March 12, 2026.
10. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'), and find that it would not be unfair to postpone the eviction until April 30, 2026, pursuant to subsection 83(1)(b) of the Act.
11. I have considered all the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the Act, and find that it would not be unfair to postpone the eviction until April 30, 2026, pursuant to subsection 83(1)(b) of the Act. The Landlord's legal representative requested that the eviction be delayed in recognition of the Tenant's long-standing tenancy, which has been in place since 2014. In view of the length of the tenancy and the Tenant's history of maintaining the tenancy over many years, I am satisfied that it is just and equitable to grant a brief postponement of the eviction to allow the Tenant an opportunity to pay the outstanding arrears.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$3,893.81 if the payment is made on or before April 30, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenant may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after April 30, 2026, but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before April 30, 2026.**
5. If the unit is not vacated on or before April 30, 2026, then starting May 1, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
6. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after May 1, 2026.
