



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

2960 DON MILLS ROAD APTS (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict GANJ ALI MATIN, KARIMA MATEEN, JAMSHED AHMADI and JAHED MATIN (the 'Tenants') because the Tenants did not pay the rent that the Tenants owe.

The application was scheduled to be heard on March 31, 2026, by video conference. Before the start of the hearing, the parties engaged in private settlement discussions and advised that they had reached a settlement to resolve all matters at issue in the application. They requested an order on consent. The matter was referred to Dispute Resolution Officer (DRO) Nancy Fahlgren to assist in finalizing the terms and issue the requested order.

The Landlord's representative, Jamuna Bhatnagar, and the Tenant, Karima Mateen for the Tenants, were present. The Tenant met with Tenant Duty Counsel before the hearing.

Upon reviewing the terms of the consent with the parties, I was satisfied that the parties understood the terms and consequences of their consent.

Agreed Facts:

1. As of the hearing date, the Tenants were still in possession of the rental unit.
2. The lawful rent is \$3,123.70. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
3. Based on the monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$102.70. This amount is calculated as follows: \$3,123.70 x 12, divided by 365 days.
4. The Tenants have paid \$6,640.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
5. The rent arrears owing to March 31, 2026 are \$4,532.32.
6. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
7. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$3,123.70 from the Tenants and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.
8. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$21.57 is owing to the Tenants for the period from December 1, 2025 to March 30, 2026.
9. The Landlord and the Tenants further agreed to an order that would permit the Tenants to preserve this tenancy and avoid eviction by paying the full amount owing as set out in this order, including additional rent that will come due, by no later than April 15, 2026.

On consent, it is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenants is terminated unless the Tenants void this order.
2. **The Tenants may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$7,842.02 if the payment is made on or before April 15, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenants may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenants has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after April 15, 2026 but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenants may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenants do not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenants must move out of the rental unit on or before April 15, 2026.**
5. If the Tenants do not void the order, the Tenants shall pay to the Landlord \$1,530.35. This amount includes rent arrears owing up to the date of the hearing and the cost of filing the application. The rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit are deducted from the amount owing by the Tenants. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
6. The Tenants shall also pay the Landlord compensation of \$102.70 per day for the use of the unit starting March 31, 2026 until the date the Tenants move out of the unit.
7. If the Tenants do not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before April 15, 2026, the Tenants will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from April 16, 2026 at 4.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before April 15, 2026, then starting April 16, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after April 16, 2026.
