



**Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006**

Esther Ajayi Tenant

HARRINGTON HOUSING INC (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Esther Ajayi (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on April 8, 2026.

Only the Landlord's Agent, Yasemin Mamaloglu, attended the hearing.

As of 1:42 p.m., the Tenant was not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the LTB. There was no record of a request to adjourn the hearing. As a result, the hearing proceeded with only the Landlord's evidence.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenant did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. Based on the 28 day rental period, the daily rent/compensation is \$37.14. This amount is calculated as follows: \$1,040.00 divided by 28 days.
4. The Tenant has paid \$6,512.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
5. The rent arrears owing to April 8, 2026 are \$40.00.
6. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.

7. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$1,040.00 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.
8. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$42.16 is owing to the Tenant for the period from July 13, 2024 to April 8, 2026.
9. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'), including whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenant, and find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.
10. The Tenant did not attend the hearing and did not present evidence on this issue. Given the small quantum of arrears owing, the Landlord requested a short postponement of eviction to allow the Tenant the opportunity to void this order.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
3. \$1,306.00 if the payment is made on or before May 6, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
4. The Tenant may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after May 6, 2026 but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
5. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before May 6, 2026.**
6. As of the date of the hearing, the amount of the rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit exceeds the arrears of rent, compensation and the cost of filing the application the Landlord is entitled to by \$856.16. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing. However, the Landlord is authorized to deduct from the amount owing to the Tenant \$37.14 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting April 9, 2026 until the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
7. The Landlord or the Tenant shall pay to the other any sum of money that is owed as a result of this order.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before May 6, 2026, then starting May 7, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.

9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after May 7, 2026.
