



Order under Section 69 Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

Jeong Wha Hong Tenant

Toronto Seniors Housing Corp. acting as agent for Toronto Community Housing Corp (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Jeong Wha Hong (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on April 28, 2026.

The Landlord's Legal Representative, Adam Fraccaro attended the hearing.

As of 1:48 pm, the Tenant was not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the LTB. There was no record of a request to adjourn the hearing. As a result, the hearing proceeded with only the Landlord's evidence.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a valid Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice). The Tenant did not void the notice by paying the amount of rent arrears owing by the termination date in the N4 Notice or before the date the application was filed.
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful rent is \$827.00. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
4. Based on the Monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$27.19. This amount is calculated as follows: \$827.00 x 12, divided by 365 days.
5. The Tenant has paid \$632.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
6. The rent arrears owing to April 30, 2026, are \$7,371.00.

7. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
8. There is no last month's rent deposit.
9. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'). The Landlords administrative staff have reached out to the Landlord to discuss a payment plan for the arrears in this application, with no response from the Tenant.
10. The Landlord's Legal Representative was not aware of any circumstances of the Tenant relevant to section 83, other than the Tenant is 79 years of age. The Tenant was not present at the hearing to provide any evidence of such circumstances, and there is otherwise no evidence in the record before me that suggests eviction should be refused or delayed. I find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$8,384.00 if the payment is made on or before May 17, 2026. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenant may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after May 17, 2026 but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before May 17, 2026.**
5. If the Tenant does not void the order, the Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$7,491.32. This amount includes rent arrears owing up to the date of the hearing and the cost of filing the application. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
6. The Tenant shall also pay the Landlord compensation of \$27.19 per day for the use of the unit starting April 29, 2026 until the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
7. If the Tenant does not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before May 17, 2026, the Tenant will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from May 18, 2026 at 4.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before May 17, 2026, then starting May 18, 2026, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.

9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after May 18, 2026.
